

Western Health Provides Schedule for H1N1 Immunization Clinics for November 2 - 4

For the following clinics scheduled November 2 to 4, H1N1 vaccination will be limited to the following high risk groups:

- Children six months up to fifty-nine months of age (under the age of 5 years).
- People five years of age, up to and including 24 years of age, with chronic health conditions.
- Pregnant women in the second half of their pregnancy (20 to 40 weeks).
- Parents or other primary care givers (up to two per child) of children under the age of six months, and of immuno-compromised children and young adults (up to and including 24 years of age) who can not themselves be vaccinated.

The above high risk groups can be vaccinated at the following locations.

As part of the H1N1 immunization registration process, persons are required to have their MCP Card with them at the time of registration. People are asked to wear short sleeves or easy roll up sleeves.

All residents will have access to the H1N1 vaccine. Western Health will update the schedule as more information is available. The Provincial Government, working with the Regional Health Authorities, will monitor the mass immunization program as it rolls out and changes may be made to the existing plan.
