We are acting on the Mi'kmaw community's recommendations outlined in the <u>Framework</u> and Action Plan.

- 1. You can now take your sacred items into surgery! Expect to have a conversation with your perioperative nurse to decide a safe place for it during the procedure.
- 2. Smudging policy is in place! You can request a smudge through a member of your healthcare team.
- 3. In fall 2023, with the support of community, we held a speakers series and smudge education sessions for healthcare staff.
- 4. In partnership with the Mi'kmaw Cultural Foundation, we are seeking funding to place artwork in healthcare facilities.

Did you Know?

In Mi'kmaq culture we believe every person has a role in our nation and every person has a gift. Traditionally, ceremonial roles start by being a helper. A respected Elder may receive a spiritual message in ceremony that you have the potential, through fasting and earning, to be responsible for Ceremony. This path will include our old ways, using oral traditions passed down through generations. This takes years of sharing, learning and earning. Elders and Knowledge Keepers earn ceremony through guidance of another and will share who mentored them. Be patient, never assume and understand everything comes at the right time.

Indigenous Patient Navigator

Melissa Muise, Indigenous Patient Navigator, offers in-person services for the healthcare facilities in the Corner Brook area and virtually, upon request and availability, to other healthcare facilities within the western region.

Some of the responsibilities of an Indigenous Patient Navigator include:

- Help remove barriers and challenges that patients may face with healthcare systems.
- Assist individuals in connecting with community cultural support.
- Attend appointments with the patient if they need extra support.
- Respond to general guestions related to healthcare systems.
- Visit patients during their stay at healthcare facilities in the Corner Brook area or meet virtually to other healthcare facilities based on individual request and availability.

NL Health Services Update

Announced as part of Budget 2022, the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador initiated the process of amalgamating Central Health, Eastern Health, Labrador Grenfell Health, Western Health, and the Newfoundland and Labrador Centre for Health Information (NLCHI) into one entity, Newfoundland and Labrador Health Services (NL Health Services). The transition to a single, unified Provincial Health Authority was undertaken to integrate and streamline provincial programs and services to become more efficient and effective in our health-care delivery across the province. Because of this transformation, our region is now referred to as the Western Zone.
